Best Poster Presentation Award Japan



Mr. Nalaka Wijekoon, PhD student in Anatomy, Interdisciplinary Center for Innovation in Biotechnology & Neuroscience, University of Sri Jayewardenepura, has secured a 'best research poster presentation award' and a gold medal at the 4th AIST International Imaging Workshop held from January 15 to 22, 2017 at the Biomedical Research Institute, AIST, Japan.

He competed with 20 candidates from 10 countries including India, China, Korea, Thailand, Pakistan, Mongolia and Japan who had been selected out of 179 eligible applications received worldwide.

This is the second consecutive award received by USJP from AIST. The first award was secured in 2016 by the PhD students under the supervision of Prof. Ranil de Silva, Director, Interdisciplinary Center for Innovation in Biotechnology & Neuroscience, USJP.

Best Paper and Poster won by Prof. Sandun Senarath in Philippines



Professor Sandun Senerath's outstanding research papers co-authored together with Jhoan Rhea L. Pizon, Olga M. Naneza, Mylene M. Uy and Dana Joanne Von L. Trono were recognized at the 14th MSU-IIT Annual in-house Review of Research and Development Projects organized by the Iligan Institute of Technology of the Mindanao State University, Republic of Philippines in April, 2017. "Inhibition of Alpha-Amylase and Antioxidant activities

of the Bark Extracts of Black Current Tree (*Antidesma Ghaesembilla* Gaertn)" was awarded the Best Paper in the research category of the graduate level while "In-Vitro Alpha-Amylase Inhibitory activity, Antioxidant potential, and GC-MS analysis of Crepe-Ginger (*Costus speciosus* (J. Koenig.) Sm.) Leaves" was awarded as the Best Poster Paper.

Prof. Sandun Senarath from the Department of Botany at the University of Sri Jayewardenepura and visiting lecturer at the Mindanao State University – Iligan Institute of Technology, Philippines is an expert in plant tissue culture with one patent and many research publications in refereed journals. Her research activities concern the study of plant tissue culture for conservation of endangered medicinal plants, mass propagation for commercial scale plantations, plant tissue culture phytochemical screening of natural plants and tissue cultured plants, cell culture for secondary metabolite production in addition to Synthetic seed technology and cryopreservation.

Ph.D student wins Gold Medal by the SLAYS Open Forum 2017



Mr. Rumesh Liyanage who is reading for a Ph.D Degree at the Faculty of Graduate Studies, University of Sri Jayewardenepura was awarded a Gold Medal by the SLAYS Open Forum 2017 held on 28th February and 1st March 2017 at Hilton Residencies, Colombo, under the theme of "Research for Impact: March of the Sri Lankan Young Scientist" supervised by Prof. S.B. Nawarathne (Principle supervisor), Prof. K.K.D.S. Ranaweera and Dr. Indira Wickramasighe.

This award was granted by the Sri Lanka Academy of Young Scientists (SLAYS) and National Science Foundation Sri Lanka (NSF) in collaboration with Coordinating Secretariat for Science, Technology and Innovation (COSTI). There were around 150 scientists, and ten post graduate research studies (Only MPhils and PhDs) were selected by the foreign and local expert panel for the gold medal.

Prof. Ranil De Silva, Director, Interdisciplinary Center for Innovation in Biotechnology & Neuroscience, was awarded a competitive national research grant by the Ministry of Primary Industries together with the National Science Foundation (NSF) on his multi-disciplinary and multi centre project titled "Proactive Roles of Ceylon Cinnamon in Health, leading to product development".

The Ministry of Primary Industries together with Prof. Ranil de Silva, and NSF, initiated the special project on Cinnamon focusing on value addition to the Ceylon cinnamon to increase the global market share of Ceylon Cinnamon. The project called for research proposals from researchers islandwide, selecting 5 detailed projects to be awarded 50 million rupees worth research grants. The inauguration ceremony of the project was held on the 28th February

2017, at the Auditorium of the Ministry of Primary Industries headed by the Hon. Minister Daya Gamage.

This national project is expected to evaluate the curative effects of the Ceylon Cinnamon on protective health leading to innovative product development.

The National Institute of Advanced Industrial Science & Technology (AIST), Japan will fully fund the evaluation of In vitro cellular effects of Ceylon Cinnamon Species on cell lines; Queensland University of Technology, Australia, The European Graduate School of Neuroscience (EURON), Netherland; University of Gothenburg, Sweden; The George Washington University, USA and University College of London, UK are also assisting this project with international funds and advanced technology through Private-Public Partnership.

Sri Lanka's first ever social robotic platform developed in the robot "ViduJaya"



Sri Lanka's first ever social robotic platform has been developed by Dr. P. Ravindra S. De Silva, Didula Egodage, Lakshitha Madhushan, Udaka Manawadu and Thilina Madushanka. This robot named "ViduJaya" is an autonomous robot that can interact with humans or other autonomous physical agents by following social behavior. Dr. P. Ravindra S. De Silva and his research team are from the Department of Computer Science of the Faculty of



Applied Sciences, University of Sri Jayewardenepura as a photographer; robot "ViduJaya" can capture natural expressions of humans while encouraging them to express their natural behaviour.

Research Grants Awarding Ceremony 2017



Research Grants Awarding Ceremony 2017 was held on 6th March 2017 at Fingara Town and Country Club (Pvt.) Ltd. This event was hosted by the Research Council of the University of Sri Jayewardenepura. The idea of this research grant award scheme is to encourage and aid research among the academic staff of the university, in keeping with the importance that research is given in the university.

This year, there were 6 awards given to the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences, 16 for the Faculty of Applied Sciences, 5 for the Faculty of Management Science and Commerce and 15 for the Faculty of Medical Sciences.

Immunohistochemistry Laboratory established at the Center for Cancer Research



A fully equipped immunohistochemistry laboratory, funded by the Cancer Research Grant/USJP, was established in January 2017. This lab provides the infrastructure & facilities necessary for the identification of novel tumour markers in formalin fixed and paraffin embedded tissue sections.

Immunohistochemistry (IHC) is a method for localizing specific antigens in tissues or cells based on antigen-antibody recognition. IHC has a long history that dates back more than 70 years, when Coons first developed an immunofluorescence technique to detect corresponding antigens in frozen tissue sections. Immunohistochemistry combines anatomical, immunological and biochemical techniques to identify discrete tissue components by the interaction of target antigens with specific antibodies tagged with a visible label. IHC makes it possible to visualize the distribution and localization of specific cellular components within cells and in the proper tissue context.

IHC has been the subject of thousands of research papers and today the vast majority of scientific publications in anatomic pathology incorporates some immunohistochemistry findings.

Inauguration of the Centre for Ragging, Sexual Harassment, Gender Equity and Equality

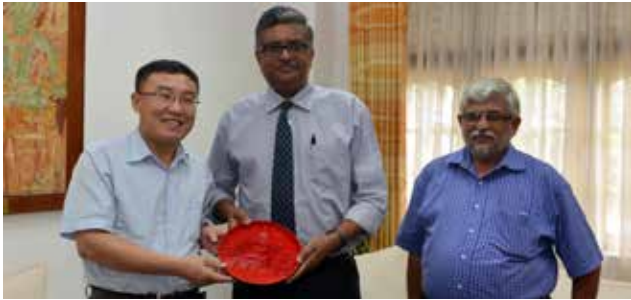
Annual Underwater Training Program for Archaeology (Special) undergraduates at Galle MAU

Prof. Sagarika Ekanayake was elected as the Chairperson of the General Research Committee for the year 2017 at the Sri Lanka Association for the Advancement of Science (SLAAS).



Dr. Jayantha Wijayabandara received US Patent for a new drug discovered for type II diabetes



US patent has been obtained by Dr. Jayantha Wijayabandara, former Coordinator and Senior Lecturer of the B. Pharmacology Degree Program, Faculty of Medical Sciences, for a novel pharmacological property of β – Amyrin Acetate derived from *Tabernaemontana dichotoma* (Sinhala – Divi Kaduru) as a potent β – glucosidase inhibitor. This discovery also provides for the use of this compound as a novel oral hypoglycemic drug in the treatment of type II diabetes being approximately 35 times potent compared with Acarbose, a standard drug widely prescribed for type II diabetes patients.

Dr. Wijayabandara and his research team at the International Center for Chemical and Biological Sciences (H. E. J. Research Institute of Chemistry and Dr. Panjwani Center for Molecular Medicine and Drug Research), University of Karachi, Pakistan are now working to explore commercialization of this invention through developing this molecule into a pharmaceutically elegant dosage form.

Dr. Wijayabandara's achievement has brought prestige not only to the University of Sri Jayewardenepura but also to Sri Lanka as a whole.

Professor Dinithi Peiris as keynote speaker



Prof. Dinithi C. Peiris, from Dept. of Zoology was the Keynote Speaker of the two day International Conference on Recent Advances for Quality Enhancement in Science & Technology held in January, 2017. This international conference was organized in collaboration with International Association of Research Scholars (IARS), Australia. Director, Indian Institute of Science Education & Research (IISER) Mohali, Prof. N. Sathyamurthy was the Guest of Honour. In her keynote address, Professor Peiris emphasized on the use of less toxic therapy for treatment of cancer and other diseases.

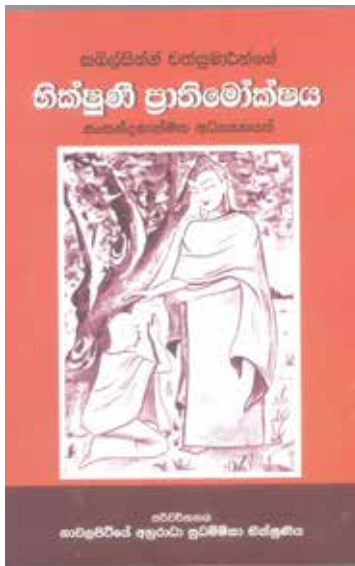
Inauguration of CTHE 2017 and Certificate Awarding Ceremony

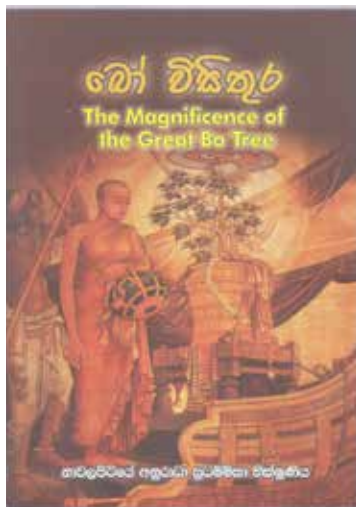

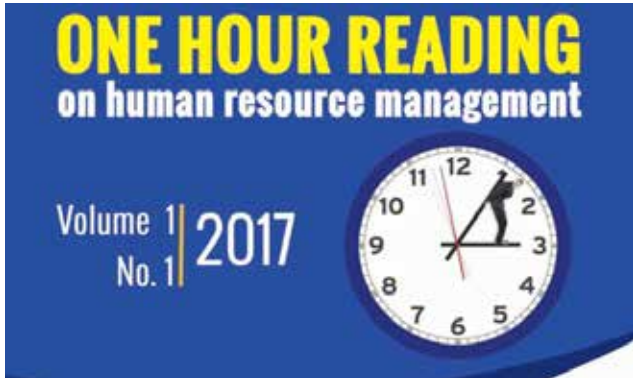

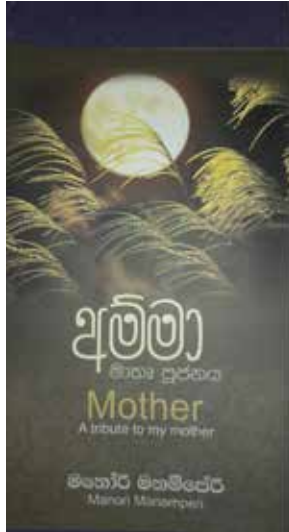

‘Rata Kata Haa Heta’ by Dr. Shantha Hettiarachchi



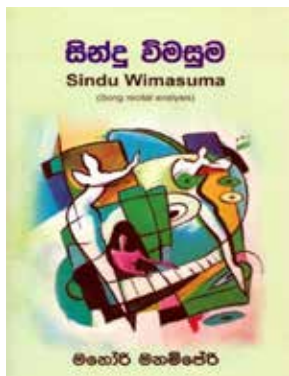

In honour of the creation of Vidujaya, we carry an article by Dr. Ravindra de Silva, Director, Center for Robotics and Intelligent System on the process of its making.



Historically, industries and researchers have exerted great efforts into developing automation machines as a robot to perform tasks more effectively than humans can do. However, the outcomes are not suitable for utilizing robots in other application areas due to lack of intelligence, communication, social interaction, collaboration, and learning, etc. The newly established areas of human-robot interaction (HRI) and social robotics are exerting efforts into addressing the above issues by designing robots that have human capabilities (communication, interaction, and behavior) in support of human-centric applications.



Do you still just imagine these kinds of robots might exist, and do you have any experience in interacting with these robots in Sri Lanka? How do you feel about BB-8 in the scientific fictional movie "Star Wars"? How does BB-8 communicate, behave, and interact with others? Even a

robot's body is very different from a human's. But BB-8's behaviors and interactions are very much similar to those of a human or animal (showing the characteristics of animacy). Such kinds of fictional movies have inspired and influenced the design, development, and thinking



behind innovative robotic platforms for society, which is why robots have recently become a part of our everyday lives, being put to work in hospitals, schools, and homes. Therefore, we introduce and transfer this knowledge in order to design/develop this type of robots in Sri Lanka.

A team from the Department of Computer Science, Faculty of Applied Sciences, University of Sri Jayewardenapura have come up with a cute looking innovative robot. This falls under the category of Social Robotics and, this is the 1st of its kind in the country. They must have a lot to say, let's listen to them.

Social robotics is a new exposure for Sri Lanka

Generally, robots are known for their accuracy, precision, effective, logical decisions making powers, high processing powers, strength etc, which makes them very valuable in fields like constructions, medical, agriculture, financial etc. The main difference is, what we have developed, is a Social Robot. Social Robotics is a fresh field for Sri Lanka as well as for the global arena. It's a trending research area where the researchers are paying more attention currently. Since, using robots in areas of education, entertainment, social services, where social skills are a necessary factor, is very rare and challenging, and it is still a struggling aspect in robotics. And that is how social robotics came into play. In social robotics we try to mimic a human, the daily routines, behaviors, reactions in specific situations, the steps or the instruction in following a procedure by a person and the expressions are thoroughly observed, and used as inspiration for the development of a robot. The main objective of social robotics is to minimize the artificial and mechanical behavior of the robot and to give natural feel by embedding more human like behaviors. Achieving these targets of social robotics was our main concern and we have developed a very successful social robot.

The Idea

Children are usually changing their activities/behaviors within a very short of time period while they are playing or interacting with someone. Therefore, children are not always willing to listen to instructions for appearing for photographs when the parent is willing to shoot. Even, when they take a photograph with instructions, it ruins the naturalism of expressions and attractions of the photograph. In addition, children are usually very attached to their toys, and some other objects in their eye-level to build-up their own world (society) in home-setup or kindergarten. Some parent/carers enter to their world (playing space) to capture (shoot) expression while they are playing or interacting with some objects, mostly their entrance distracts child's world, and the child gives up his activities, which hinders the chance to capture attractive photographs. The concept of Vidujaya is directing as futuristic interactive robot that is capable of capturing natural and attractive photographs while interacting/playing with children. Through this interactive process, parent/carers are able to collect attractive photographs of the child from Vidujaya by establishing a playing/interactive scenario.

Design of the Robot

Social robots target three main factors; design, animacy, and anthropomorphism. The design was built up from the scratch by our team, starting from the sketches, following the design patterns, learning the 3D designing technologies and even 3D printing. Providing animacy, making the robot look alive was another one of the major challenges. The target group of this robot is kids. Our main objective was to gain the attention of the target group and make them respond to the robot. For this purpose animating technologies played a major role, which were carefully designed considering psychological factors. We observed the target group over the period of time. Their behavioral patterns and their reactions were analyzed and used to

give more human like behavior (anthropomorphism) to the robot and to increase the familiarity for the target group. Using the balanced combination of these three concepts we were able to develop the robot successfully resulting in a robot that is capable of recognizing the target group, and adjusting its behaviors according to feedbacks and reactions.

Naming Robot

The hardest part other than making the robot was naming it. We were undecided between few suggestions that we received. Since this was the first robot developed by the University of Sri Jayawardenepura, we wanted to make a connection to the university as well. There were several names that are commonly used in the university, which has direct connection to the university. And "Vidhu-Jaya", was one of them. We think the name suits him better, it will stand as a symbol, a milestone in Sri Lankan robotic journey.

Multi- disciplinaries research area

Working in the social robotics arena is not an easy task, because it is defined as a multi-disciplinary area. Social robotics uses engineering, computer science, electronics, social sciences, psychology, mathematics, statistics and much more disciplines.

When working in developing research areas, it is very rare to get a visible final product where you can clearly witness the change you have done, but by working on social robotics students get the chance to apply their theoretical knowledge, combining it with their common social knowledge to produce a high quality end product.

The success journey

We had a considerable basic knowledge when we started off the project. But our main obstacle was finding the required physical resources. Robotics is a fairly new industry in the Sri Lankan market, and it was not easy to find out the necessary resources. We spent days and days browsing through the streets of Pettah to find the required gadgets. But that didn't stop us, our dreams kept us running towards our goals. Dr. Ravindra de Silva was the constant force that powered us. He lent us his personal resources, allowed us to use his personal office space to carry out the project, where we spent uncountable sleepless nights. Our hard work was finally paid off, making "Vidujaya" a milestone in Robotics in Sri Lanka.

Also we need to make a special note on the physical design of "Vidujaya". The cute face and the savvy design that you see is a creation of our team, from drawings to, 3D designing to 3D printing. 3D printing was a new arena to the country back then. Although our faculty had a 3D printer, we had no idea how to operate it, we had to learn from the scratch, from opening the package to getting an object printed. There were numerous technical difficulties, to which we had to find solutions by ourselves. Now for our team 3D printing has become as easy as taking a normal printout.

The journey we had, during the last five months, was not an easy one. There were so many obstacles so many hurdles, but together as a team we were able to overcome them and find solutions to every problem that we faced. All together it was an amazing journey, taught us a lot about teamwork, and gave us technical experience which we cannot gain by simply reading a book.

The reasons behind the success

Undergraduates who follow the Computer Science Special degree at our faculty need to conduct a research in their fourth year. This was the research theme selected by Didula Egodage and team; Thilina Madushanka, Udaka Manawadu and Lakshitha Madushan under the guidance of our mentor, Dr. Ravindra de Silva. By developing and advancing a small concept within about 5 months, we were able to come up with the 1st ever social robot in Sri Lanka, and to be the initiators of the first Ever social robotics platform in the country.

We are extremely privileged to have Dr. Ravindra de Silva as a lecturer of the department and most importantly as our mentor. He has intimate knowledge and firsthand experience on Social Robotics from working at Toyota Japan and Toyohashi University, Japan. If not for him, there wouldn't be a "Vidujaya".

Support from the university

Support extended by the Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Sampath Amarathunge was a huge strength for us. Also, the Dean of the Faculty of Applied Science, Prof. Sudantha Liyanage and Head of the Department of Computer Science Dr. Ananda Edirisuriya were backing us from the start to the very end. Support extended by academic and non-academic staff of the department and all our beloved friends should be highly admired. Their help and support is what made "Vidujaya", a huge success.

Future

This is our first product, we were at level zero, when we started making "Vidujaya". But now we have improved a lot and are more experienced. So, we expect to come up with better and more successful products in the future.

And also this is not the end of "Vidujaya", it keeps getting better and better everyday, with new suggestions, new ideas and new technologies. Our plan is to make "Vidujaya" the most sophisticated social robot available in the industry. We are ready to bring more innovative products to the global arena, and make a name for Sri Lanka in the global robotics industry. Keep an eye on us, because the best is yet to come.
